Mitch served as a member and chairman of the St. Louis County Civil Service Commission from 2000 – 2012. He is a member of Focus St. Louis, where he previously served on the Finance and Strategic Planning Committee (1994-1996), and is a member of the St. Louis Sports Commission. He was the attorney for the local organizing committee that hosted the NCAA Final Four in 2005.

A Washington University alumnus, Mitch has always been active with his alma mater. He was a member of the Washington University Law Review in 1982 (and Articles Editor in 1983); president of the W Club, the Athletic Alumni Association, from 1998 – 2003; and chairman of the board of the Washington University's Student Media, Inc., WU's the student publications' governing body, from 1999 – 2007. Mitch was elected to the WU Sports Hall of Fame in 2004 for varsity baseball (1975-1977). Most recently Mitch was elected to the Alumni Board of Governors for the 2015-2016 term.

Also active in city government, Mitch has served the City of Clayton on its Strategic Issues Committee (1994), the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Architectural Review Board (1998-2002).

AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Recognized for his professional and civic contributions, Mitch was selected as the St. Louis ACLU Volunteer of the Year (1995), voted one of Ten Outstanding Young St. Louisans (1995) and awarded the St. Louis Equity in Education Award (1998).
